What is Guadeloupe known for?

Guadeloupe also encompasses the smaller islands of La Desirade, Les Saintes (also called 'les des Saintes'), and Marie-Galante, which also offer beautiful beaches and quaint villages. All Guadeloupe's islands boast excellent opportunities for birding; photography; hiking; and water sports such as snorkeling, swimming, and diving.

Is Guadeloupe a volcanic arc?

The two halves of Guadeloupe are geologically distinct. The western half is part of an active volcanic arc that extends from Saba to Grenada. The eastern half is part of an older extinct volcanic arc that includes Anguilla, Saint Martin, Saint Barts, Barbuda, Antigua, Grand Terre and Marie Galante.

Is Guadeloupe a Catholic Diocese?

Administratively, the territory of Guadeloupe is part of the Diocese of Basse-Terre and Pointe-à-Pitre, attached to the Catholic Church in France. [79] The diocese includes the territories of Guadeloupe, St. Barthélemy and St. Martin and the number of faithful is estimated at 400,000.

Who is the president of the Departmental Council of Guadeloupe?

The elected president of the Departmental Council of Guadeloupe is currently Guy Losbar (1 July 2021); its main areas of responsibility include the management of a number of social and welfare allowances, of junior high school (collège) buildings and technical staff, and local roads and school and rural buses.

Why is France located in Guadeloupe & Martinique?

This location in the region allows France to reach a large part of the eastern coast of the American continent. The exclusive economic zone formed by Guadeloupe and Martinique covers just over 126,146 square kilometres. [62]

Is Guadeloupe extinct?

Guadeloupe was formed from multiple volcanoes, of which only La Grande Soufrière is not extinct. Its last eruption was in 1976, and led to the evacuation of the southern part of Basse-Terre. 73,600 people were displaced throughout three and a half months following the eruption.
