What is Laos wind power project?

It is the first wind power project in Laosand the largest single wind power project undertaken by Chinese enterprises overseas. The project will transmit electricity to Vietnam when completed, the first of its kind in Laos to realize cross-border transmission of new energy power.

Where is a wind farm located in Laos?

The project is located in Sekong and Attapeu, southern provinces of Laos. It includes a 600 MW wind farm, a set-up switchyard and transmission lines. It is the first wind power project in Laos and the largest single wind power project undertaken by Chinese enterprises overseas.

When will The 600MW monsoon onshore wind farm start production in Laos?

The 600MW Monsoon onshore wind farm in Laos is expected to begin power production in 2025. Onshore wind farm development Sekong and Attapeu, Southern Laos 600MW Monsoon Wind Power Mitsubishi, ACEN Renewables International, Impact Electron Siam, STP&I, BCPG, and SMP Consultation Construction of the Monsoon wind farm commenced in April 2023.

What is the monsoon wind power project?

The 600MW Monsoon Wind Power Project is a landmark initiative under construction, featuring a 500KV transmission line linking Laos to Vietnam, and is planned to be completed by 2025. As the first wind farm in Laos and the largest in Southeast Asia, Monsoon set a new benchmark by establishing a bankable cross-border Power Purchase Agreement.

When did monsoon wind start construction in Lao PDR?

November 2022: Turnkey EPC Contract signed with POWERCHINA. December 2022: Concession Agreement signed with GOL for the first wind farm in Lao PDR. March 2023: Monsoon signed a \$692.55 million non-recourse project financing package with lenders. March 2023: Construction of Monsoon Wind began.
