Prime Minister Edi Rama visited the construction site of the Erseka Solar Park in Kolonja in Albania's southeast, after his government gave the green light in June for starting the works. The developers, Favina, Favina 1 and M& K Energy Trading, have received two approvals for 20 MW each.

Smart Gynesh Energy Technology, Smart Energy Group, and Erseka Solar also offered 40.3 MW at EUR0.05353/kWh and another project of 20.2 MW at EUR0.05628/kWh. Solar Park Gjorica, Infotelecom, and Adam Global Energy proposed 35.6 MWh at EUR0.0397/kWh, while Eco Park Group, Birra Peja, Vlorem Energy shpk, Future Energy Trading, and Exchange ...

Albania"s recent 300 MW solar tender, launched by the Ministry of Infrastructure and Energy, received a lowest bid of EUR0.0397/kWh. Fourteen developers submitted proposals totaling 355.93 MW, with nine shortlisted bidders offering ...

4 ???· Three support mechanisms for renewable energy are applied in the Republic of Moldova: net billing to cover own consumption; a 15-year feed-in tariff for producers with a capacity of up to 1 MW; and a fixed price with a guarantee to purchase the energy produced for 15 years, granted through auctions.

Erseke Solar PV Project is a 75MW solar PV power project. It is planned in Korce, Albania. According to GlobalData, who tracks and profiles over 170,000 power plants worldwide, the project is currently at the permitting stage.

ERE is also launching commercial licensing procedures for special purpose vehicle (SPV) Erseka Solar Park 1, one of three 20-MW solar projects that local companies Favina and M& K Energy Trading are developing near the southern city of Korce.

The tie-up between Turkish energy group Smart Gunesh Teknolojileri and Albania"s Erseka Solar divided its project proposal into two lots with installed capacities of 40.3 MW and 20.2 MW respectively.
