Nexen operates the Buzzard field and platform in the United Kingdom.

Where does Nexen invest in oil sands?

Nexen's oil sands investments include interests in the Long Lake project, the Syncrude joint venture and 656,000 undeveloped acres (gross) in the Athabasca oil sands in northern Alberta. During the year ended December 31,2011, the Company acquired a non-operated interest in Poland and by beginning to test shale gas opportunities in Colombia.
