

What is the energy access problem in Mali?

Mali faces a critical energy access challenge. The national power access rate was 50% in 2019 (compared to 36.11% in 2015). The problem is particularly acute in rural areas with 21.12% access rate in 2019 (compared to 15.75% in 2015).

What is the power access rate in Mali?

Power generation is limited (Annex A.17), forcing Energie du Mali (EDM, the power utility) to have recourse to frequent load shedding.

Where does Mali get its electricity from?

The other source is the Manantali dam, in Mali, which stores about 11 billion cubic meters of water. The nearby Manantali 200 MW hydropower station is the main one in the region and, supplies 55 percent of its electricity to Mali, while the rest is equally shared between Mauritania and Senegal.

Is energy du Mali subsidized?

Energie du Mali (EDM), the state-owned electric utility, is poorly managed and heavily subsidized by the government and regional multinational banks, as the relatively high price of its electricity (average \$0.17/kWh) is insufficient to cover the cost of production and distribution (\$0.24/kWh).

Mali Overview. Mali's electricity production is dominated by hydraulic (55 per cent) and diesel (45 per cent) sources. Although Mali is endowed with good solar and hydro potential, it presently accounts for only



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310MW of installed capacity to serve a population of around 18 million people.

Touna Solar Power Station, is a planned 93 MW (125,000 hp) solar power plant in Mali.
