What is the most accessible coral reef in Norfolk Island?

These bays, along with neighbouring Cemetery Bay (CB), represent the most accessible reef within the Norfolk Island coral reef ecosystem and are an important area for recreational activities.

Where is Norfolk Island?

Norfolk Island (/ˈnɔːrfɪk /NOR-fɪk, locally /ˈnɔːrfoʊk /NOR-fohk; Norfuk: Norf'k Ailen) is an external territory of Australia located in the Pacific Ocean between New Zealand and New Caledonia, approximately 1,412 kilometres (877 mi) east of Australia's Evans Head and about 900 kilometres (560 mi) from Lord Howe Island.

Is crAssphage present in Norfolk Island wastewater?

The crAssphage concentration in Norfolk Island wastewater was marginally (0.4 log 10) greater than reported for these same 10 Australian WWTPs (Ahmed et al., 2023). However, detection of HF183 and crAssphage simultaneously indicates the presence of human wastewater pollution.

Does Norfolk Island have a radio station?

Norfolk Island does not have its own dedicated ABC Local Radio station but the island is covered by ABC Western Plains which broadcasts on 95.9 FM from its studios in Dubbo in mainland Australia.

Is there a safe harbour on Norfolk Island?

A downward slope exists towards Slaughter Bay and Emily Bay, the site of the original colonial settlement of Kingston. There are no safe harbour facilities on Norfolk Island, with loading jetties existing at Kingston and Cascade Bay. All goods not domestically produced are brought in by ship, usually to Cascade Bay.

Did Norfolk Island have self-governance?

Norfolk Island was the only non-mainland Australian territory to have had self-governance. The Norfolk Island Act 1979, passed by the Parliament of Australia in 1979, is the Act under which the island was governed until the passing of the Norfolk Island Legislation Amendment Act 2015 (Cth).

A. heterophylla is endemic to Norfolk Island (29.03° S, 167.95° E) a small island territory of Australia located approximately 750km north-west of New Zealand. In its native range it is classified as Vulnerable by the IUCN red list (Thomas, 2011) on account of its restricted distribution and threats from invasive species and habitat modification.

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
