President Emmerson Mnangagwa officiated the groundbreaking ceremony for a new 720MW coal thermal power plant, developed by Titan New Energy in partnership with ZESA Holdings in Hwange. According to The Herald, Titan Energy has invested US\$1 billion in the 720MW Phase 1 project, along with plans for an additional 200MW solar plant to be ...

As of October 2024, the 720 MW Titan power station was reportedly slated to be completed by the end of 2025. Titan New Energy proposal. In December 2024, Zimbabwe's president led a groundbreaking ceremony for a 720 MW coal-fired power plant being developed in Hwange by a partnership between Titan New Energy and ZESA Holdings.

Titan Energy has invested US\$1 billion into the 720MW Phase 1 and an additional 200MW solar plant to be constructed in Gweru under Phase 2. Construction is set to begin immediately, while some units are expected to feed the grid by the end of next year.

The 720MW project is a partnership between Titan New Energy and ZESA Holdings, and Mnangagwa is scheduled to lead the ceremony on Monday, December 2, at Tutu Ingagula, located along Chaba Black Road in Hwange.
